



U.S. GLOBE Regional Student Research Symposia

At the GLOBE* Virtual Student Research Symposia (SRS) students in grades K–12 will come together online to share the results of their GLOBE research with their peers and STEM professionals.

- This is a two-week event: May 5–9 (high school) and May 12–16 (middle school), from noon to 2 p.m. ET each day. A session for K–4 students will be added depending on interest.
- Students and educators are welcome to attend as many sessions as they would like but are only expected to attend on the day of their presentation.
- The Virtual SRS is **free** for students and educator participants.

Sample agenda

- 30-minute discussion by a STEM professional who will share their career journey.
- 45-minute presentation sessions in which students present their research to their peers and a STEM professional.
- 45-minute discussion with a STEM professional during which students will further discuss their research and participate in peer review.

At the Virtual SRS, students will:

- Present their research via a recorded presentation.
- Discuss their research with scientists.
- Talk with other students about their research and provide them with feedback.
- Hear from STEM professional about different careers.
- Have fun! There will be plenty of virtual engagement opportunities for students and educators.
